Therefore, these changes are necessary to bring the rules into statutory and administrative compliance, as well as, to clarify operational processes of AHCCCS related to those who hold a designation of seriously mentally ill.
R9-Chapter 34	04/01/2024	04/01/2024	04/26/2024	Yes, partial.	Following the Administration’s 5YRR, submitted to Governor's Regulatory Review Council on February 29, 2024, technical and clarifying updates need to be made. Chapter 34 contains the Administration’s regulations pertaining to Grievance and Appeals processes for resolving disputes or complaints. These regulations ensure individuals have a fair and accessible process for addressing issues.

R9-22-Article 18	03/19/2024	03/19/2024	05/21/2024	Yes, partial.	Chapter 22, Article 18 will contain the Administration's regulations pertaining to excluding individuals or entities from participation in the system who pose an undue risk of fraud, waste, and abuse. These rules will preserve the due process rights of excluded individuals and entities and reduce legal uncertainty by setting forth the process by which an exclusion determination may be appealed as well as the process to be followed for reinstatement of participation. Technical and conforming changes also need to be made.
