# **NEMT Changes**

- Background:
  - High error rate during CMS audit and tribal concerns
  - Workgroup formed –Tribal representatives
  - Workgroup submitted recommendations for change
- NEMT Implementation Plan:
  - Phase 1 is being implemented



#### Tribal Outreach

- Tribes informed via Tribal Consultation meetings.
- Information distributed by AHCCCS Tribal Relations Office
- Regional Tribal Broker Forums
  - July 21, 2014, 1-3 pm, Phoenix
  - July 24, 2014, 10-12 pm, Tucson
  - July 31, 2014, 12-2 pm, Flagstaff (see Forum Handout)



#### **NEMT Broker Model**

#### Broker:

- Operate statewide.
- Manage the Medicaid transportation program for Fee-for-Service members.
- Will not provide NEMT services.
- Contract with Providers to complete the services.
- Required to have appropriate Tribal support staff.



# **NEMT RFP Update**

#### Process:

- Request For Information (RFI)
  - 6 NEMT Vendors made presentationsnarrowed to 3
- Selection of Broker via RFP Process
- Timeline:
  - October 1, 2014 Publication of RFP
  - December 3, 2014 Proposals due
  - March 1, 2015 Contract awarded
  - September 1, 2015 Broker Services Start Date



## **Expected Outcome**

- Accountability and oversight.
- Better service to AHCCCS members.
- Tribes can determine their own network of Providers—internal or external.
- Tribal business licenses required for Providers operating on tribal lands.
- Tribes can more readily resolve NEMT issues with the assistance of a Broker.

# Independent Tribal ALTCS Providers

#### Background:

- Past Direct Care Service Agencies were limited in number on reservations.
- As an alternative, AHCCCS allowed independent Providers to operate on reservations if they met the qualifications.
- Lack of oversight and training of IP's was a concern to AHCCCS and Tribes.
- Workgroup was formed—Tribal Representation



# **Proposed Model**

- Managed Care: Contract with Direct Care Service Agencies
  - Will provide employment, oversight, training and other benefits for Independent Tribal Providers (ITP).
  - Impacts 8 Tribes utilizing 446 ITP's statewide.
- Options for Tribes and Independent Providers:
  - IP's can utilize Direct Care Service Agencies for employment.
  - Tribes can establish tribally owned and operated Direct Care Service agencies.



#### **Tribal Outreach**

- DHCM-ALTCS Unit:
  - Tribal Consultation meetings.
  - Regional Forums with Tribes, Independent Tribal Providers and Direct Care Service Agencies (North, Central and South regions of state, see Handout).
  - Upon request will schedule meetings with individual tribes.
- Transition Completion Date: December 2014
