

## Need A Job? Let AHCCCS Help!

Employment services are available in different ways, including:

- Through your AHCCCS health plan,
- From Rehabilitation Services Administration/ Vocational Rehabilitation (RSA/VR), and
- From Community Resources.

Employment services are available for Medicaid-eligible individuals, of all ages, receiving Behavioral Health or Division of Developmental Disabilities (DDD) services. These are services that can help members prepare for employment or maintain em-



ployment. Reach out to your behavioral health or DDD provider to learn more.

Rehabilitations Services Administration/Vocational Rehabilitation (RSA/VR) is the state employment program that provides a variety of services to persons aged 14+ with disabilities with the ultimate goal to prepare for, enter into, or retain employment. To be eligible for RSA/VR, an individual must:

- Have a documented disability,
- Have a disability-related barrier that prevents getting and keeping a job, and
- Require VR services & be able to benefit from VR services
