SUBJECT: CYE 2024 American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act Home and Community Based Services and Behavioral Health Outpatient Services Directed Payment

AHCCCS intends to conclude the time-limited ARP directed payments with a 2024 payment through its AHCCCS Complete Care (ACC), Arizona Long Term Care Elderly and Physically Disabled (ALTCS-EPD), Arizona Long Term Care Developmental Disabilities (ALTCS-DD), Comprehensive Health Plan (CHP), and AHCCCS Complete Care Regional Behavioral Health Agreements (ACC-RBHA) Health Plans to providers of Home and Community Based Services (HCBS), Behavioral Outpatient Services (BHOP), and Rehabilitative services.

These payments will be made similar to payments made in CYE 2022 and CYE 2023 and are contingent upon approval by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) 42 CFR § 438.6(c) preprints and the Arizona State Legislature. To the extent that CMS may require changes to the payment methodology and/or process as a condition of approval, this guidance may change and be updated.

These payments outlined below are meant to be a **FINAL** one-time directed payment for HCBS and Rehabilitation providers. AHCCCS will not continue this funding in the future.

The guidance below is for all lines of business, except ALTCS-DD. The Department of Economic Security Division of Developmental Disabilities issued its own guidance and requirements for ALTCS-DD providers, which can be found at the following link: <u>DDD ARP web page</u>

Guidance for FFS providers will be provided at a later date.

Non ALTCS-DD Lines of Business Directed Payment

A directed payment uniform percent increase equivalent to 15% for select provider types and select procedure codes will be applied to actual utilization for the period of October 1, 2022 through March 31, 2023. The increase is applicable to specific provider types and categories of service outlined in Attachments A and B.

The increase is applicable to all members, both dual and non-dual in all lines of business except ALTCS-DD. See below for information regarding ALTCS-DD directed payments. AHCCCS will compute the directed payment amount based on claims and encounter data in the AHCCCS database for the period of October 1, 2022 through March 31, 2023 to determine the directed payment amount for each provider. Only approved and adjudicated AHCCCS encounters as of November 7, 2023 will be utilized in determining providers that meet this criteria. AHCCCS will not consider any other data when determining which providers qualify for the directed payment. Additionally, AHCCCS will not approve payments to providers that purchase an entity eligible for directed payments anytime during or after the

identified utilization period (October 1, 2022-March 31, 2023). Please note that providers AHCCCS determines are ineligible for payments will be excluded, either before or after attestation.

Financial Accountability for Eligible Non ALTCS-DD Providers

Eligible providers are required to distribute at least <u>80%</u> of the directed payment amount to direct care staff in the form of a temporary increase in salary, wages, and/or stipends, including employee related expense costs.

The remaining **20%** of the directed payment amount may be expended on costs associated with enhancing, expanding, and/or strengthening HCBS services such as recruitment of direct care workers.

Funds need to be used for expenditures that occur from January 1, 2024, to February 28, 2025. This date will not be further extended. Directed payment funds must be used to supplement and not supplant existing funding.

Please note: If funds are not spent by February 28, 2025, the funds are subject to recoupment.

To be eligible to receive payments, providers must complete the HCBS ARP attestation. Providers who do not submit a completed ARP attestation will not receive payments. The online portal can be found at the following link: AHCCCS ARP Provider Attestation 2024

The Provider will attest to the following:

- I agree to the following and attest that the information provided herein is true and accurate to the best of my knowledge:
- I understand that this will be the final ARP payment made to providers.
- I understand that Directed Payments are subject to recoupment if AHCCCS determined, through
 an audit or otherwise, that services reimbursed from October 1, 2022, through March 31, 2023,
 which formed the basis for the directed payment calculation, were not provided in the specified
 utilization periods, if billing or payment was improper, if duplicate payments for services
 occurred, or in their discretion the TIN is ineligible for payment.
- I attest that all funds will be spent by this provider by February 28, 2025.
- I attest that this provider will spend at least 80% of the amount of the directed payment for Direct Service Provider staff expenses, including temporary increases to salary, wages, bonuses, hiring/retention incentives, stipends, over-time, and/or employee related expense costs (like coverage of medical, dental, and vision insurance and retirement plans) associated with Direct Service Provider staff expense. (See below for definition of Direct Care Worker).
- I attest that this provider will spend no more than 20% of the Directed Payment for other expenses that enhance, expand, and/or strengthen HCBS. Examples of such distributions

include, but are not limited to mileage reimbursement, tuition or continuing education reimbursement, childcare and/or enhanced insurance coverage reimbursement, recruitment costs, staff recognition and appreciation events, training, technology expansions or expanded capacity.

- I attest that the funds will be used for expenditures that occurred from January 1, 2024, to February 28, 2025, and the funds will be used to supplement and not supplant existing funding.
- I understand that if this provider violates this agreement or spends this payment in a manner that does not comply with these guidelines, the payment may be recouped, and further action may be taken.
- I acknowledge that this is a final payment and I understand that AHCCCS will not continue this funding in the future.
- I acknowledge that the following expenses are unallowable: Cash and gift card distributions, as well as distributions to owners or their spouses.

Providers who receive this Directed Payment may be audited at any time by AHCCCS and/or its contractors. Audit findings that funds are not spent in the manner outlined above or that the provider cannot demonstrate compliance with this agreement through appropriate documentation may be the basis of recoupment of the Directed Payment in whole or in part. Providers shall maintain all necessary documentation and records regarding the use of these funds for auditing purposes for a period of seven (7) years.

Providers are ineligible for payments if they have been terminated or are under a payment suspension by AHCCCS.

Provider Payments - Health Plans

<u>No later than April 30, 2024,</u> AHCCCS will provide lists to each of the Health Plans showing the directed payment amounts to be paid for providers eligible for this directed payment via SFTP server. AHCCCS requires that the Health Plans make payments to providers by **May 31,2024.**

Additional Information:

For the purposes of this Directed Payment, AHCCCS uses the term Direct Service Provider staff to describe a vocationally diverse workforce of licensed and unlicensed personnel who provide a wide range of covered health care services directly to AHCCCS members in their home or community-based settings. The HCBS covered services that are delivered by Direct Service Providers include services such as attendant, personal care and homemaker services; home health, habilitation and rehabilitation; and behavioral health services that support mental health and substance use treatment.

Under these broad service designations, job titles of staff of the Direct Service Providers vary by employer or population served. For example:

- · Home health aides provide non-skilled services under the direction and supervision of an RN and include monitoring of a member's medical condition, health maintenance or continued treatment services, and activities of daily living.
- · Intermittent Nursing Services are provided by RNs or LPNs under the supervision of an RN or physician. LPNs may only provide Intermittent Nursing Services if they are employed by a Home Health Agency.
- Direct Care Workers, providing direct service assistance to people with intellectual and developmental disabilities are called direct support professionals while their counterparts serving people with physical disabilities or age-related support needs, are generally called direct care workers or caregivers when serving individuals in assisted living settings.
- Personnel who serve Members with behavioral health needs may be employed as licensed behavioral health professionals (BHPs) providing direct service to members, in roles such as; social worker, nurse, or behavioral analyst. BHPs also provide clinical oversight or supervision to unlicensed personnel. Likewise, unlicensed personnel serve members with behavioral health needs as behavioral health technicians (BHTs) or behavioral health paraprofessionals (BHPPs). Unlicensed BHTs and BHPPs are employed in jobs such as case manager, rehabilitation specialist, job developer or peer support specialist.

• Direct Supervisor who works directly with members, is primarily responsible for the supervision of the daily activities completed by Direct Service Provider staff and has oversight for the proper delivery of services to members and can act as a Direct Service Provider staff when needed.

Please Note: distributions to owners or spouses of owners and executive staff are unallowed.

Activities that enhance, expand, or strengthen HCBS services:

Examples of activities that enhance, expand, or strengthen HCBS services include, but are not limited to, the following:

- *Mileage reimbursement,
- *Reimbursement for tuition or continuing education,
- *Reimbursement for childcare and/or enhanced insurance coverage,
- *Recruitment costs (job ads/marketing),
- *Staff recognition and appreciation events,
- *Training,
- *Expanding Use of Technology, and
- *Expanding Capacity.
