Barriers (including all data since 10/1/2016):

From 10/1/18 until roughly 3/1/19 we stopped receiving release reports from Cochise, Pima, Pinal, and Yuma counties. As of today, 5/21/19, Banner received weekly release reports from Pima, Pinal and Yuma county.

Maricopa county barrier was being able to meet with members in the jail. As of 5/1/2019 Banner now has ability to complete video visitation within Maricopa County Jail.

Roughly 191 of the identified individuals did not receive a scheduled release date.

20 of 38 who had scheduled release date were release on that date, others were released earlier, can range from weeks to months, which makes it extremely difficult to schedule doctor appointments.

Criteria:

Member incarcerated for at least 30 days or longer and have an anticipated release date, AHCCCS eligible, 4 or more ED visits within 6 months prior to incarceration, 4 or more inpatient admits within 6 months prior to incarceration, Total cost of \$50,000 within 6 months prior to incarceration, Ongoing acute care need (e.g. dialysis), Chronic medical condition (e.g. diabetes), Behavioral health and/or substance use issue (i.e. MAT) and High recidivism rate of 2 or more incarcerations over 30 days within 6 months



Justice Reach-In Program Criteria

Members who have been incarcerated for thirty (30) days or longer and have an anticipated release date may be eligible for the Reach-In Program. Of the potentially eligible members, they must also meet criteria for a complex/chronic physical and/or behavioral health condition, which puts them at high risk and the need for care coordination to ensure their needs are addressed timely. The following are considered high risk conditions. Members may have one or multiple conditions to qualify for the Reach-In Program.

- Describe the conditions/criteria used at your health plan to determine "complex-need" members: All SMI Members and GMHSU Members who have a chronic health condition including Substance Use Disorder and who are incarcerated for 30 days and have a scheduled release date are eligible for Reach In chronic health conditions are listed on the Justice Transition Notice (attached). This is the criteria, but we routinely provide Reach In services for individuals who do not have a scheduled release date, and individuals who may not have been incarcerated for 30 days but have significant needs.
- total number of members reached pre-release (and method used to reach them; e.g. in-person, video visit, probation, etc.) A variety of methods are used to reach Members, including video visitation, probation, and care coordination. We work collaboratively with our partners to get appointments scheduled and communicated.

Criteria:

Criteria could include an SMI determination, GHM with past utilization of a level 1 inpatient psychiatric facility, past utilization of a chemical dependency residential treatment facility, past utilization of a detox facility, SABG priority such as IV drug user, opiate replacement medication, diagnosis of CHF, COPD, high risk OB, HIV, Hepatitis c on antiviral medications, multiple incarcerations, and/or a referral from the criminal justice system. Prescribed opiates and/or benzodiazepines for chronic (not post-surgical) use with MEDD score > 90 and/or DEDD score > 40. High risk suicide attempt in past 12 months.

These individuals were identified from Coconino, Gila, Mohave, Navajo, Yavapai County and the Arizona Department of Corrections (DOC). Apache County does not provide a roster with incarcerating or release dates.

The Justice System Liaison identifies members releasing from jail/prison who meet Justice Reach-In criteria by having one or more of the following conditions:

HIV Positive

Pregnancy

Incarceration Recidivism

Seriously Mentally III (SMI)

Asthma

Diabetes Type 1

Congestive Heart Failure (CHF)

Homeless, inadequate housing

End State Kidney Disease – on dialysis

Substance Abuse Disorder

Hepatitis C – receiving treatment

General Mental Health Chronic Care

Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD)

Hypertension

Provide the method used to reach members pre-release from jail/prison:

UnitedHealthcare Community Plan utilizes the 834 file to identify members incarcerated, and the detention censuses to obtain release dates. Once release dates are set, the Justice Liaison contacts the facility and schedules a video visitation, when possible, to reach member's during the pre-release period. The video conference may be remote from an electronic device or at the detention center.
