Mission: Reaching across Arizona to provide comprehensive, quality health care for those in need

Agency Description: The Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS), the State's Medicaid Agency, uses federal, state, and county funds to provide health care coverage to eligible enrollees. Since 1982, when it became the first statewide Medicaid managed care system in the nation, AHCCCS has operated under a federal Research and Demonstration 1115 Waiver authority that allows for the operation of a statewide managed care model.

Executive Summary: As a delivery system that serves nearly 1.9 million Arizonans and spends \$38 million per day, it is critical that AHCCCS pursue a broad array of strategies that are focused on creating a sustainable program.

It is within this context that this plan was developed. The plan offers four overarching strategies which will guide the overall direction AHCCCS will take over the course of the new fiscal year. These four strategies build on previous accomplishments and represent the collaborative efforts of the AHCCCS leadership team.
