ARP-CET Funding Overview



AHCCCS Funds Statewide Partnership to Strengthen Arizona's HCBS & LTC Workforce

MCCCD was awarded \$25.7 million in American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act Section 9817 funding to support the ARP Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) Workforce Development Career Education and Training initiative. This initiative aims to increase the number of individuals who join the workforce to pursue health care careers while decreasing the number of workers who leave the field.















MARICOPA | HB2691-Behavioral Health Funding Overview

Behavioral Health Workforce Demonstration Pilot Program

AHCCCS has selected two Arizona community college systems, MCCCD and Northland Pioneer College (NPC), to receive federal funding that will address behavioral health workforce shortages. The two-year funding opportunity will provide MCCCD with \$6.8 million through September 2024, with an additional \$3.4 million through September 2025 (contingent upon legislative approval and appropriation of a third year), to expand behavioral health programs.























MARICOPA | HB2691-Behavioral Health Funding Overview



Expanding the number of two and four-year behavioral Health degree programs and non-degree, credit and non-credit programs.

Curriculum

Ensuring the curricula of the behavioral health degree and certificate programs are aligned with the functional requirements of the various jobs performed, and services provided.



Providing scholarships and tuition assistance to eligible students who want to earn a two- or four-year degree or a credit or non-credit certificate.

Targeted Investments 2.0

- \$250 million authorized by CMS in October, 2022 as a part of 1115 waiver.
- Five year project providing resources to PCP and BH outpatient providers to support.
 - Effective coordination with health care providers and community partners, and
 - Identify and reduce inequitable health outcomes of their patient population.
- Incentive payments based on meeting process- based milestones and performance measure targets.



Targeted Investments Programs

- 10/2016 9/2022
- 6 Years, \$350M
- Reduce fragmentation of Behavioral Health (BH) and primary care (PCP)
- Increase provider integration, coordination
- Improve health outcomes for members with complex conditions

Renewal Program

- 5 Years, \$250M
- Identify and address health inequities
- Implement Culturally and Linguistically Appropriate Service (CLAS) standards
- Identify and address health related social needs (HRSN)

Annual Incentive Structure

- Year 1: Onboarding/Application year
 - o Payments to eligible provider types that submitted application with required documentation by 9/30/2023.
 - o Payments disbursed in Summer 2024

Year 2:

- o Meet targets on performance measures.

Year 3:

- Demonstrate efficacy of policies and protocols through a random sample review, and
- o Meet targets on performance measures.
- Year 4 and Year 5: Performance measures only



Participation - PCP and BH

PCP and BH Programs

- Participation at the organization (Tax ID) level for AHCCCS enrolled clinics
- Choose Area(s) of Concentration: Peds PCP, Peds BH, Adult PCP, Adult BH

Behavioral Health

Licensed 77-BH outpatient and ICs enrolled with AHCCCS under the same Tax ID.

Primary Care

Primary care outpatient clinics enrolled with AHCCCS under the same TIN

- Each PCP location must be enrolled with AHCCCS as a service address under an
 01-Group or IC Provider ID at time of application, and
- OB/GYNs encouraged to participate.



Participation- PCP

- PCP payment is driven by number of members assigned to the organization's PCPs that work at participating clinics.
- Participants must ensure Health Plans and AHCCCS provider enrollment records are pristine, including each PCP's:
 - Termination or Active date
 - $_{\circ}$ Tax ID affiliation
 - Service Locations
 - Specialites



Participation - Justice

AHCCCS-enrolled ICs, FQHCs, RHCs, or other outpatient settings readily available to deliver PCP and BH services that best demonstrate collaboration with an adult justice partner with application commitment letter.

Competitive

- Signed commitment letter containing minimum data elements uploaded with application.
- Selected applicants will have the strongest commitment letters that detail the best plans to address the primary care, behavioral health, and health related social needs of high-risk individuals transitioning from the criminal justice system in their community.
- Examples:
 - Colocation with probation/parole,
 - Coordination with local courts and diversion programs, and
 - Encourage novel, innovative models demonstrating robust partnerships.



Participation - Justice

AHCCCS will accept applications for clinics expected to open by 9/30/2024:

- Regional clinics open by 9/30/2023 will have competitive advantage.
- Must provide services by 9/30/2024.
- First incentive funds will be received fall 2025 if facility is not enrolled with AHCCCS by 9/30/2023.
- Contact the TI team for additional information.



Application

Applicants must:

- Submit an application by 5 PM (MST) 10/20/2023- Application portal available now.
- Attest that all participating clinics under the TIN use, or plan to adopt, an EHR system capable of bi-directional data exchange with the HIE (Contexture) and connect to the new platform once available.
- Implement care coordination policies and procedures with defined criteria by 9/30/2024.
- Applicants must upload documentation to demonstrate prerequisite policy and procedures containing minimum elements with the application.

Accepted Participants

- Acceptance letters to be sent in December 2023
- Year 1 incentive payment fall 2024



PAX Tools for Human Services is for human service professionals who work directly with youth.



PAX Tools for Community Educators is for health and community educators who work with parents and caregivers in their communities.



PAX Tools for Youth Workers is for youth workers, volunteers, and part-time staff who work directly with youth.



PAX Tools for Caregivers is for parents, grandparents, and foster and kinship caregivers.







Provides trauma-informed evidence-based behavioral health strategies for **youth-serving professionals**.

Operationalizes a trauma-informed approach for organizations and individuals who work with youth.

Includes strategies and materials for **professionals** to use with youth in their practice and **guiding caregivers** in utilizing strategies in the home.





Provides trauma-informed evidence-based behavioral strategies to support Foster Parents, Adoptive Parents, Kinship Care Providers, and other Caregivers.

Unwinding Progress



Processing Renewals

- Eligibility for all 2.5 million members will be re-determined.
- Members are AT RISK of losing coverage if they are:
 - 1. **Non-Responsive:** fail to supply needed documentation
 - Factually Ineligible: shown not to meet at least one condition of eligibility
- After a full redetermination, members are either found *eligible* and **stay** enrolled or *ineligible* and **disenrolled**.
- Prioritizing renewals for people determined ineligible during the PHE.
- It will take approximately 12 months to complete ALL renewals.






Eligibility Dashboard

This data reflects renewal progress from April 2023 to current








Eligibility Dashboard

Member Outreach and Assistance

- Updating contact information before initiating the renewal.
- Notification about upcoming renewal the month before the renewal month.
- Sending reminders to respond to renewal forms and provide proof.
- Added attempts to contact members when renewal form is returned in the mail.
- Sending reminders after discontinuance about 90-day reconsideration period and appeal rights.



Closing the Uninsured Gap

If no longer eligible for AHCCCS:

- The State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP) Helpline (for people with Medicare) 1-800-432-4040
- Veterans Administration (for veterans), and beconnected.org, or

Eligibility Updates



Postpartum Coverage Extension: Key Provisions

12-months of continuous eligibility postpartum for people eligible and enrolled in AHCCCS while pregnant (including during a prior quarter month).

- Benefit Details: State plan full service package.
- Program Began: 4/1/2023
- The extension does not apply to people eligible only during a period of presumptive eligibility.



Postpartum Coverage Extension: Key Provisions (continued)

- Individuals are entitled to the extended postpartum coverage regardless of the reason the pregnancy ends.
- The customer's 12-month coverage period only end early if:
 - The customer voluntarily stops their AHCCCS coverage,
 - The customer is no longer a resident of the state,
 - AHCCCS determines that eligibility was approved incorrectly, or
 - The customer dies.



Continuous Eligibility for Children

The Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 added continuous eligibility (CE) for children under 19, starting 1/1/2024.

- When approved for AHCCCS, including KidsCare, a child remains eligible until the next renewal with limited exceptions.
- At renewal the child's eligibility is redetermined, and
 - If eligible, then the child is reapproved for another continuous eligibility period.
 - If no longer eligible, AHCCCS coverage is discontinued.



Continuous Eligibility for Children (continued)

During the CE period the child's eligibility may only be stopped for one of the following reasons:

- KidsCare eligibility may stop if the child qualifies for and is moved to an AHCCCS Medicaid category,
- The customer voluntarily stops the AHCCCS coverage,
- The customer is no longer a resident of the state,
- AHCCCS determines that eligibility was approved incorrectly, or
- The customer dies.

Overview of State Plan/ State Plan Amendments (SPAs)

- Each state has a Medicaid state plan that describes how the state will administer its Medicaid program.
- The State Plan is the basis for federal financial participation in the Medicaid program, attesting to the State's compliance with federal regulations.
- In order to alter a State Plan, states must submit State Plan Amendments (SPAs), and receive approval from CMS.



Upcoming SPAs

Physician Administered Drugs (Effective 10/1/23)

Adjust the reimbursement methodology for Physician Administered Drugs for providers outside of IHS/638 facilities.

Rapid Whole Genome Sequencing (RWGS)

(Effective 10/30/23-7/30/26)

Provides an additional payment for medically necessary RWGS when established clinical criteria is met. Costs associated with RWGS will be billed separately from the inpatient episode.



Upcoming Submissions

Differential Adjusted Payment (DAP) 2024

- Effective: 10/1/23
- Purpose: AHCCCS will submit 3 DAP SPAs specific to inpatient, nursing facility and outpatient providers.
- DAP is intended to distinguish providers that have committed to designated actions to improve patient care, improve member health and reduce cost of care growth.
- DAP providers receive a positive adjustment to the AHCCCS fee-for service rates contingent upon accomplishing DAP milestones.

Fee For Service Rate Updates (Effective 10/1/23)

The following fee for service rates (posted here) will be adjusted:

FQHC/RHC	Ambulatory Surgical Center Fee Schedule
Hospice	Durable Medical Equipment Fee Schedule
Ambulance	Clinical Laboratory Fee Schedule
Physician Drug Schedule Rates	Physician Fee Schedule
Inpatient Hospital APR-DRG	Adaptive behavior assessment codes will have FFS rates.
Inpatient Hospital LTAC Hospital and Rehab	Modifier CO and CQ to indicate services provided by a PT/OT Assistant will be paid 85% of the fee schedule
AZEIP Speech Therapy Rates	15 specific dental codes will receive a 10% rate enhancement when provided in Flagstaff.

Member Exploitation and Fraudulent Billing

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The Fraud Schemes

- Recruiting vulnerable tribal members into unlicensed, unregistered facilities
- Enrolling non-AI/AN members in the American Indian Health Plan
- Providing incentives (housing, food, money, alcohol, drugs)
- Billing fraudulently
- Shuffling members between companies

- Paying recruiters "per person"
- Billing for members who aren't present (ghost billing)
- Billing for services that aren't provided
- Overlapping use of codes, double billing
- Shell companies
- Multiple types of fraudulent providers


Top Challenges

- Finding members:
 - Bad actors were using unlicensed unregistered facilities
 - Ghost billing
 - Congregate settings
- Member cooperation:
 - Some members may not want to leave
 - Some don't see themselves as victims
 - Some are coerced and afraid to report
 - Some members are not interested in treatment, limiting BH facility for residential treatment

- Resources:
 - Housing demand vs supply
 - Assessing who needs BH/SUD
- Communication:
 - Sensitive information
 - Active criminal investigations
- Safety:
 - Reports of violence, weapons in facilities



Completed System Improvements to Stop Fraudulent Billing and Protect Members





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PROVIDER ENROLLMENT CHANGE

Implemented a provider enrollment moratorium on BH Outpatient Clinics, Integrated Clinics, NEMT, CSAs, and BHRFs In place for 6 months, can be renewed in 6 month increments

MEMBER ENROLLMENT CHANGE

Require enrollment change requests in writing in order to move a member from MCO to AIHP

EMERGENCY EXCLUSION RULES PUBLISHED

Emergency rulemaking implemented to enhance AHCCCS authority to exclude providers affiliated with bad actors


POTENTIAL FUTURE PLANS

- Establish AIHP enrollment criteria
- Additional trend reports and data pulls
- Provider registry
- Explore the feasibility of Tribal MCOs
- Increase care coordination and case management for rural FFS populations
- Increased culturally competent care and collaborate with tribes on best practices
- Re-publish the Covered Behavioral Health Services Guide



A Credible Allegation of Fraud is a **preliminary** action required to stop payments to providers who are suspected of **potentially** fraudulent activities.

- Who receives notification?
 - Provider
 - Managed Care Plans
 - TRBHAs
 - ADHS
 - Internal AHCCCS Divisions





AHCCCS receives allegation, conducts a preliminary investigation, and may informally consult with a law enforcement agency (LEA).* AHCCCS determines allegation is credible.







LEA accepts referral of Credible Allegation of Fraud and opens criminal investigation. Cases can be prosecuted by the Attorney General, the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), and Internal Revenue Service (IRS).

**Partner law enforcement agencies are usually Medicaid Fraud Control Units (MFCUs). In Arizona, the MFCU is located in the Health Care Fraud & Abuse section of the Arizona Attorney General's office. Cases can be prosecuted by the Attorney General, the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), and Internal Revenue Service (IRS).





AHCCCS imposes payment suspension. Payments to provider stop. Providers may continue to serve Medicaid members, but will not be reimbursed.



Providers can appeal and/or submit written evidence demonstrating good cause and/or refuting the fraud allegations.



LEA conducts an independent criminal investigation. At the same time, AHCCCS continues its investigation and provides relevant info to the LEA.

If a good cause exception is found per 42 CFR 455.23, payments to provider may continue in whole or in part.





LEA completes investigation and files criminal charges against provider.





When the legal proceedings are complete, provider is required to repay improperly reimbursed amounts to AHCCCS and all criminal or civil penalties. Provider is terminated from AHCCCS system and excluded from current and future participation in state and federal health care systems.



Credible Allegation of Fraud Notice

- Notice includes the following:
 - Information specific to the conduct that is determined to be a CAF,
 - Explanation of the suspension of payment actions, and
 - Provider's rights including right to provide written evidence, request an informal settlement conference, and to request a state fair hearing.



Reporting Suspicious Activity

There is no wrong door to report suspicious activity

- Report suspicious criminal activity to the <u>FBI</u>
- Report facilities violating licenses to <u>AZ Dept. of Health Services</u>
- Report provider or member fraud to <u>AHCCCS Office of Inspector</u> <u>General</u>
- Report concerns with AHCCCS quality of care or barriers to care using the <u>Quality of Care Concern online form</u>, by calling (602) 417-4885, or by emailing CQM@azahcccs.gov.

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
