

Telehealth Advisory Committee Telehealth Best Practice Guidelines for Health Care Providers

June 2022

Background

By June 30, 2022, the Telehealth Advisory Committee (Committee) is required to submit recommendations regarding telehealth best practice guidelines for health care providers. The Committee began meeting in July 2021 in accordance with A.R.S §36-3607. To further evaluate telehealth best practice guidelines for health care providers, the Committee authorized separate best practice guidelines behavioral and physical health subcommittees to review national and other standards for telehealth best practices and relevant peer-reviewed literature and provide recommendations to the Committee. After initial meetings of the subcommittees, it was determined that in the spirit of healthcare integration, the two subcommittees should be combined to one best practice subcommittee to address both physical and behavioral health best practice guidelines, which was authorized by the Committee.

Best Practice Guidelines Recommendations

The telehealth best practice guidelines subcommittee meetings were held on February 24, March 24 and June 1, 2022. The composition of the subcommittee was made up of the Committee co-chair, committee members, and a non-committee member with telehealth best practice guideline subject matter expertise.

The subcommittee initially discussed the options for the adoption of telehealth best practice guidelines for Arizona, including the development of guidelines directly by the subcommittee. After further evaluation of the availability of best practice guidelines by national organizations, as well as peer-reviewed literature published, the subcommittee made the determination that the adoption of already developed guidelines was the most effective and sustainable strategy for Arizona.

After this determination, the subcommittee synthesized all telehealth best practice guidelines that were identifiable based on web-based searches, including the use of PubMed, and subject matter expert knowledge of guideline availability. After this best practice guideline compilation, the committee reviewed for recommended Arizona adoption based on the following criteria: 1. Guideline relevance to Arizona providers; 2. Provider type(s) targeting; 3. The year the guideline was last updated and if information is still current; 4. Guideline availability in the public domain; and 5. If guideline was pandemic-specific and/or had long-term applicability. Table I identifies the telehealth best practice guidelines that were recommended for Arizona adoption based on this review.

The Telehealth Advisory Committee met on June 23, 2022, and voted unanimously in support of adopting this best practice guideline listing. The Telehealth Advisory Committee will continue to evaluate the need for revisions to this best practice guidelines list at a minimum of annually, including the ongoing review of national and other standards for telehealth best practices and relevant peer-reviewed literature.
