c. Benefits - Benefits for AACP and the expansion population authorized by the 1115 Demonstration will mirror all benefits as defined in the Medicaid State Plan, unless otherwise noted within these STCs.

i. Notice - The State must notify CMS (Central and Regional Offices) in writing when proposing a State Plan amendment (SPA) that would impact the expansion population authorized by the 1115 Demonstration inclusive of:

1. The proposed date of implementation,

2. The date the State plans to submit the SPA,

3. Written evidence of the State's compliance with the public notice process, with a reporting of key issues identified during that process and how the State took those plans into consideration when developing the Demonstration proposal; public notice and

4. Revised budget neutrality projections.

ii. Applicability - Any changes to the benefits for AACP will impact all adults 21 years and older, except members who receive services rovided through the Indian Health Services and 638 facilities. Children under the age of 21 will continue to receive the full benefit package available under the Early Periodic Screening Diagnosis and Treatment (EPSDT) program.
