

Penetration Rate

- 100 Percent of CMDP eligible members are attributed to Health Homes to encourage ongoing outreach
- January to March 2017 penetration rate was 77.1 % for members in an Open Episode of Care with a type 1 demographic
- Current penetration rate for July 2017 is at 82.3 %
- 4,170 CMDP eligible children received Behavioral Health services
- 82% of CMDP eligible children have received a Behavioral Health service during the last quarter

Trended Quarterly CMDP Penetration Rate




Top 5 Services by Units

Units by Service Type Bar Chart (FY16 Q3 - FY17 Q2)




Top 5 Services by Billed Amount


- Outpatient Treatment Services accounted for 58 percent of total expenditures








HCTC Current Snapshot


- CMDP Children Currently Placed – 50
- 70% are age 12 and under
- Currently in HCTC over 1 Year 9 (18%)
- Currently in HCTC for 9 to 12 Months 6 (12%)
- Currently in HCTC for 6 to 9 Months 6 (12%)
- Currently in HCTC for 3 to 6 Months 12 (24%)
- Currently in HCTC < 3 Months 17 (34%)

Reunification Services

- MIKID “Parent Support Now” Pilots are being initiated in Nogales and Yuma
- Resource Sharing with newly established Court Navigators in Pima County
- Initial meetings with Pima County Court to enhance DAP (Dependency Alternatives Program)

- Continued development of Foster Care Stabilization programs. Expanded to respond to DES Group Homes and Madera in Pima County.
 - Devereux in Pima County.
 - Empact in Pinal County.
- Added Touchstone to increase BCBAs, BHTs and capacity to provide FBAs in SE Arizona and expanded MST and FFT

Stakeholder Engagement

- Representatives from Regional Forums meet once per quarter at the Tucson meeting with the CEO or designee to provide input on policy and programs, identify issues and develop an annual action plan and review progress.
- 63% of Council members are Foster, kinship, or adoptive family members.

- In 2016 and 2017 C-IC provided training to all regional Foster Care Focus Groups and Foster Care Advisory Council attendees regarding Jacob's Law and changes to the system.
