


Trended Quarterly CMDP Penetration Rate

Total CMDP Enrollment vs. Total CMDP Penetration




Top 5 Services by Units

Quarterly Top 5 Procedure Codes for CMDP Children by Cost





Average Rapid Response Time - Hours




HCTC Current Snapshot

CMDP Children Currently Placed – 52

- 63% are age 12 and under
- Currently in HCTC over 2 Years 4 (7%)
- Currently in HCTC over 1 Year 5 (10%)
- Currently in HCTC for 9 to 12 Months 5 (10%)
- Currently in HCTC for 6 to 9 Months 5 (10%)
- Currently in HCTC for 3 to 6 Months 12 (23%)
- Currently in HCTC < 3 Months 21 (40%)



Average Length of Stay (days)




Respite Utilization

Reunification Services

- MIKID “Parent Support Now” has been implemented in Nogales. In Cochise County, MIKID presented to providers and Dependency Judges. They are also collaborating with Lead Dependency Judge to present for AG’s Office and lawyers. MIKID has presented at the Model Court Meeting in Pima County and presented to providers, judges and attorneys in Pinal County.
- Cenpatico participates with Pima County Court leadership and DCS leadership on a local SAFE Az “steering committee.”
- Cenpatico participates in statewide Fostering Sustainable Connections meetings to support DCS with implementation.

Network/Program Development

- Added a daily Care Coordination Call with DCS, Health Home Providers and the CRC anytime a CMDP child is admitted to the CRC.
- Monthly coordination with local DCS offices to follow up on Rapid Responses not activated.

Network/Program Development

- Arizona's Children Association has continued to expand their Birth to Five Services in SE Arizona, Pinal and Yuma.
- Working to address need for increased access to FBA's in rural areas.
