Re: Addressing the BH Needs of Children Involved with DCS – HB2442 Implementation

Please find our update on current and upcoming activities related to addressing the behavioral health needs of children involved with DCS below. As requested the following topics - Community Forums/Stakeholder Engagement, Staff Training, and Network Development are broken out into sections.

Section I: Community Forums/Stakeholder Engagement

UnitedHealthcare Community Plan (UHCCP) convened our second UHCCP-CRS Foster, Adoptive and Kinship Parent Advisory Committee (FAKPAC) meeting on Tuesday, May 24, 2016 at the Ability 360, http://ability360.org/, located at 5025 E. Washington St., Phoenix, AZ 85034 from 12:30 – 2 PM.

There are five CRS family members who participate in our FAKPAC. Names withdrawn. Participation incudes three foster parents and two kinship (grandparents) family members. Three participated by phone and two participated in person.

- Completed: Written feedback on the UHCCP CRS draft BH flyer from verbal/written feedback from committee members
- Completed: established standing meeting schedule, 4th Tuesday of each month from 12:30 2 PM at the Ability 360 and telephonically. Future dates are 6/28/16, 7/26/16, 8/23/16 and 9/27/16.

Our next scheduled Advisory Committee meeting is on 6/28/16. Some continuing agenda items:

- Discuss DD/BH Respite Issues (cont.)
- Marta Urbina will contact each FAKPAC member by end of next week to discuss their separate ideas/interests that they wish us to consider for future agenda items.

Current outreach thus far but not limited to:

- ADHS/OCSHCN disseminated the DCS Points of Contact flyer (Eng/Span) in May via their monthly enews (email formerly referred to as a Monday Memo).
- Flyer (Eng/Span). Received response from the home visitation coordinator for Navajo County. Amy Stradling works out of the Public Health Department and coordinates efforts between programs that exist through other agencies. Some of the home visitation agencies that Amy works with include: Parents As Teachers/FTF, Healthy Families/MIECHV, Health Start, Healthy Steps, and Early Head Starts. Home visiting provides families the opportunity to take part in parent education programs within the comforts of their own home that helps families raise healthy children ready to succeed in school and in life with a focus on pregnant women and families with children birth to age 5. There are approximately 20 home visitors among all the agencies in Navajo County offering home visitation programs to residents. Amy committed to disseminating the DCS Points of Contact Flyer with the home visitors. We acquired the names of the home visitation program coordinators via the Strong Families AZ, http://strongfamiliesaz.com/.
- Susan Levy, Communication Coordinator, Volunteers and Community Involvement at Native Health
 responded on 5/19/16 that she would be delighted to participate on the committee until she is able
 to have other medical staff identify potential families to participate.
- Judie Walker, UHCCP Member Ombudsman, registered to attend the Mercy Maricopa Foster and Adoptive Parent Forum at the Family Involvement Center on 6/16/16 from 5:30 7:30 AM. The goal is to be able to collaborate as a fellow RBHA, and provide technical assistance, support should opportunities/questions arise related to CRS members. One of the FAKPAC, Kinship Parents, may also be attending.
