

Children's Rehabilitative Services Application Instructions

The Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS) Division of Member and Provider Services (DMPS) Children's Rehabilitative Services (CRS) Unit reviews applications for customers who want a CRS designation.

To get a CRS designation, AHCCCS customers must need active treatment for one of the medical conditions defined in A.A.C. R9-22-1303. If the customer is not currently enrolled with AHCCCS, must enroll by:

- Applying online at www.healthearizonaplus.gov;
- Calling AHCCCS toll free at 1 (800) 654-8713; or
- Going to https://www.azahcccs.gov/Members/GetCovered/apply.html, printing and completing an AHCCCS application.

NOTE: Customers cannot receive a CRS designation or CRS services until they become an AHCCCS member.

How to Apply for the CRS Designation

To apply for a CRS designation, a CRS application can be filled out and submitted with medical records that support the potential CRS condition. Submit the completed application to the CRS Unit. Without a completed and approved application, the customer's medical condition will be treated by the AHCCCS health plan.
