







Consolidated Appropriations Act - Additional Block Grant Funding



Consolidation Act of 2021

- In December 2020, Congress approved and then-President Trump signed the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021.
- The law includes two separate investments in the SAPT Block Grant: \$1.858 billion through the annual or "regular" FY 2021 appropriations process and \$1.65 billion in supplemental funding provided as part of the law's section dedicated to COVID-19 relief



Supplemental Funding as part of Consolidated Appropriations Act

- Total appropriation: \$1.65 billion
- Allowable uses: Some flexibility communicated from SAMHSA but same target populations are required
 - O NTXIX
 - o SUD
 - o SED
 - o SMI
 - o FEP



Supplemental Funding as part of Consolidated Appropriations Act

- Allowable uses: Some flexibilities were discussed to allow states to request specific opportunities related to COVID-19 needs including:
 - o PPE
 - Transportation to vaccinations
 - Outreach
 - Workforce Development
