Employment and the Public Health Programs

SSDI/Medicare Connection

• Eligible after 24 month waiting period.

 If you get an SSDI check, you get Medicare.

 If lose SSDI from earnings, can still get Medicare for at least 93 months after the Trial Work Period.

SSI/Medicaid Connection

 SSI and Medicaid eligibility are connected in Arizona.

• \$1 of SSI means Medicaid eligibility.

 Continued Medicaid eligibility is often key consideration in return to work decision!

What happens to Medicaid?

Eligible for FREE Medicaid through a special program for SSI workers who need Medicaid to maintain employment, which is called 1619(a) and (b).



- Earnings increase to the point that an individual's monthly SSI cash benefit amount is \$0.00.
- Still receive Medicaid without a cost.
- The 2010 threshold in Arizona is \$26,638
- Individuals can request an individualized threshold.

<u>Where Does Freedom to Work</u> <u>Medicaid Fit In?</u>

- Freedom to Work Medicaid allows individuals with disabilities who work to obtain or maintain Medicaid.
- No asset limit and very high income limit.
- Most SSI beneficiaries can get Medicaid through 1619 unless want higher income or assets.
- But, many SSDI beneficiaries will join Freedom to Work Medicaid.

Freedom to Work Medicaid

- It is category of Medicaid, not a different type of Medicaid....all the same services!
- Must be disabled and between 16 and 64
- Must be employed
- Countable monthly earnings of \$2257 (this includes deducting over ½ of earnings to get to countable!)
- No asset limits

Bottom Line on Healthcare

- Medicare continues or continues for long period of time.
- SSI beneficiaries keep Medicaid up to Threshold.
- SSDI (and rarely needed, but possible SSI) beneficiaries can keep or get Medicaid through Freedom to Work.
- All work incentive Medicaid eligibility INCLUDES ALTCS services!
