Offeror discussed service requirements for adults and children.

Offeror discussed state and federal requirements specific to members with special health care needs.

Offeror described how it will promote the AHCCCS principles in its activities with respect to peer supports, housing, integration of care, application of evidence-based guidelines and screening/prevention for both behavioral and physical health conditions. Offeror mentioned employment but did not describe clearly its employment-related activities.

Offeror described an approach to bridging gaps within a changing system of care.

Offeror described how it supports a community level of care, including through its activities in northern Arizona.

Offeror discussed service requirements for adults and children.

Offeror discussed state and federal requirements specific to members with special health care needs.

Offeror described how it will promote the AHCCCS principles in its activities with respect to peer supports, application of evidence-based guidelines and screening/prevention for both behavioral and physical health conditions. Offeror discussed integration of care, although it incorrectly identified quadrants within the SAMSHA clinical integration model. Offeror mentioned housing and employment but did not describe clearly its housing- or employment-related activities.

Offeror described how it will promote the AHCCCS principles in its activities with respect to peer supports, integration of care, application of evidence-based guidelines and screening/prevention for both behavioral and physical health conditions. Offeror did not describe clearly its housing- or employment-related activities.

Offeror did not describe clearly an approach to bridging gaps within a changing system of care.

Offeror described how it supports a community level of care, including through its Boots on the Street activities.

Offeror did not clearly discuss service requirements for adults and children.

Offeror did not clearly discuss state and federal requirements specific to members with special health care needs.

Offeror described how it will promote the AHCCCS principles in its activities with respect to peer supports, employment, housing, integration of care and application of evidence-based guidelines. Offeror discussed screening/prevention activities at a relatively high level.

Offeror mentioned the AHCCCS behavioral health guiding principles for adults and children but its later referencing of principles was unrelated to those identified in the submission requirement.

Offeror's discussion of critical components addressed member rights/patient-centered care and members with special health care needs. Offeror did not address clearly recovery or resiliency.

Offeror listed seven keys to successful integration but did not describe clearly how it will apply guiding principles, concepts and member rights to service delivery.

Offeror described how it supports a community level of care, including through funding of a mobile dental clinic in response to provider outreach findings.

Offeror made reference to Autism Spectrum Disorder and children with disabilities but did not clearly discuss service requirements for adults and children, including EPSDT.

Offeror did not clearly discuss state and federal requirements specific to members with special health care needs.

Offeror described how it will promote the AHCCCS principles in its activities with respect to peer supports, employment, housing, integration of care, application of evidence-based guidelines and screening/prevention for both behavioral and physical health conditions.

Offeror described an approach to bridging gaps within a changing system of care.
