- AHCCCS intends to contract with one statewide contractor for the Integrated Acute/CRS Program

- CRS Enrollment
  - CRS children will have the option to remain enrolled with integrated CRS Contractor after their 21<sup>st</sup> birthday
- CRS Eligibility
  - o AHCCCS will be responsible for medical determinations for CRS eligibility
- CRS Access to Care
  - o Preserve the Multi-Specialty Interdisciplinary Clinics (MSIC) Model
  - Provider Network
    - Expand provider network to deliver services throughout local communities
- CRS Rule Revision
  - AHCCCS has promulgated Rules to transition the ADHS requirements under AHCCCS

- Acute Care Access to Care
  - Letters of Intent
    - Letters of Intent will not be required.
    - Networks will be reviewed during the Readiness Assessment Reviews for compliance with Network Standards. Offerors are expected to make efforts to reach out to providers in anticipation of contract award to ensure that they will have a network in place which meets AHCCCS minimum network requirements by 08/01/13.
