

Prior Authorization Guidelines ADHD Medications for Use in Children Under 6 Years Old Effective Date: July 1, 2016

FDA Approved Indication:

Treatment of Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD)

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Guidelines for Approval:

- 1. The requesting clinician has documented that the child has a diagnosis of ADHD
- 2. Psychosocial issues and non-medical interventions are being addressed by the clinical team.
- 3. Documentation of psychosocial evaluation occurring before request for ADHD medications.
- 4. Documentation of non-medication alternatives that have been attempted before request for ADHD medications.

Coverage is **Not Authorized** for:

- 1. Indications other than ADHD.
- Doses greater than FDA recommended maximum daily dosage. For doses greater than the FDA recommended dosage, Provider can submit a prior authorization with the clinical justification for the dose exceeding the FDA maximum.
