- The freeze was removed from KidsCare. Applications were accepted starting July 26, 2016 for coverage that would begin September 1, 2016.
- From September 1st, 2016 to October 1st, 2016, the population increased 12,786 members or 1%.
- The major increases in the AHCCCS population from September 1st, 2016 to October 1st, 2016 were:
 - 3,092 KidsCare
 - 2,880 SOBRA Child
 - 1,549 Transitional Medical Assistance (TMA)
 - 1,309 Prop 204 Restoration
 - 949 1931 AHCCCS for Families & Children
- There were no significant decreases in the AHCCCS population from September 1st, 2016 to October 1st, 2016
- Young Adult Transitional Insurance (YATI) population:
