Dear President Fann, Speaker Bowers, and Mr. Stavneak:

Pursuant to A.R.S. § 36-2903.01(G)(9)(f), the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS) is required to annually report to the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and to the Director of the Joint Legislative Budget Committee on the amount of Graduate Medical Education (GME) money contributed and the number of residency positions funded by local, tribal and county governments, and state universities, including the amount of federal matching monies used.

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) requires an annual State Plan Amendment (SPA) for implementation of this program, and further requires that Arizona provide copies of the intergovernmental transfer agreements once the agreements are finalized and available for review. AHCCCS received intergovernmental transfer agreements relating to sixteen GME hospitals.

Table 1 below shows the governmental contributors by recipient hospital.

These contributions provided partial funding of 1,717 full-time residents training at those sixteen hospitals. The resident count reported here reflects all residents who were funded under subdivisions (a), (b), and (c) of the statute for the sixteen hospitals.

Table 2 below illustrates the amounts distributed.



^{*} St. Joseph – Phoenix hospital received funding from two partners - Arizona State University contributed \$8,270,591.59 and the University of Arizona contributed \$3,500,000.00 of local matching funds. Phoenix Children's Hospital received funding from two partners – Maricopa Integrated Health System contributed \$3,000,000.00 and University of Arizona contributed \$8,572,428.03 of local matching funds.

The contributions from these local match sources permit the State of Arizona to leverage non-General Fund monies to invest in critical physician training, with the goal of retaining the majority of these physicians in our state upon completion of their education.

Historical levels of GME funding and the total number of GME slots are displayed below. Please note that the chart below displays all GME slots, not just the ones funded by the sixteen hospitals mentioned above.
